Over the last year the MMS Board of Directors has been working on maintaining the community to its high standards as well as the following activities and projects:

- Blue reflectors were placed on all the fire hydrants to increase their visibility
- The Board is making arrangements with an official Inspector of Elections to conduct a formal vote, as required my Davis-Stirling law, regarding STRs, property setbacks, and potential new Board members.
- The sloped pathway to the beach stairs was made safer by improving the water drainage from the slope, thus preventing moss and sludge from growing and accumulating on the path.
- The beach entrance area was beautified by removing weeds and reducing overgrowth of landscape plants.
- A new camera was installed at the entrance to the community on Orchid Drive to replace the old one that was vandalized several months ago.

Caring for Our Neighbors

There have been several reports of dogs being off-leash and/or running free in the community. One homeowner was frightened by 3 dogs acting aggressively towards him while he was on a walk on Austin Road. Another incident unfortunately resulted in another homeowner being bitten by a dog. There has been an ongoing noise issue at the short-term rental house at 5236 Louisiana Place. Despite numerous complaints to the homeowner, late night (past 10pm) noise has been a frequent problem at this home.

Please remove and dispose of your trash after visiting the beach. Help to keep our beach clean and beautiful for everyone to enjoy.

The 2025 MMS Annual Social is scheduled for Sunday, October 26th at 4pm. We hope to see you there! Updates to follow.


Full Circle in More Mesa Shores
